The 70,273 Project

We are gathering 70,273 blocks of fabric, marked with **two red crosses** to commemorate the number of physically and mentally disabled men, women and children who were murdered between January 1940 and August 1941 in the Aktion T4 Programme - a largely unrecognised atrocity.

The two red crosses represent the marks made by the assessing Doctors as to whether the person was deemed 'unfit' or an economic burden on Nazi society. It is such a simple symbol, and in this project, the simplicity with which someone could sign someone's life away is turned into a symbol of love and strength. The white fabric represents the medical records - the only information assessing physicians used in making their life-and-death determinations. Seeing the crosses stitched together sends a powerful message of tolerance, community and love. Its impact comes from the huge variety of these two red marks - each beautiful in their own perfectly imperfect way.

The blocks will be stitched into quilts and wall hangings and will be displayed in Rochester, Lincoln and Durham Cathedrals during January 2018, to mark National Holocaust Memorial Day. After that, these quilts will join others made around the world to appear in exhibits near and far.

Will you help blanket the world in XX? You don't have to be an expert stitcher – the less perfect you are the better! There are a host of ways to create a block – stitched, appliqued fabric, ribbon, fabric paint, screen print ... you can be as creative as you want. The only guidelines are that the fabric needs to be white (cotton, poly blend, wool, felt – this is a great chance to upcycle shirts and sheets and give Granny's tablecloth a new legacy) and the two crosses in red. The crosses don't need to be identical, or even the same size – we are celebrating difference after all!

Size is important! There are three block sizes, so pick which one you want to make, or make a mixture of all three – just allow a quarter inch border from your crosses to give space to stitch the blocks together. The overall size should include the quarter inch hem edge. $3.5'' \times 6.5'' / 9 \times 16.5 \times 9.5'' / 16.5 \times 24.2 \times 9.5'' \times 12.5'' / 24.2 \times 31.8 \times 12.5'' / 24$

Download, print out and fill in the Provenance Form. (if you've made a bundle of blocks you only need to fill this in once, if you are a group then each contributor needs to fill in a form.) Safety pin the sheet to the relevant block/s and send them to
